Seal towel supplies all dried up!

Staff at the RSPCA East Winch Wildlife Centre are desperately appealing to local people in the King's Lynn area to donate unwanted towels and flannels.

The centre desperately needs towels and flannels to help care for an influx of poorly seal pups and young hedgehogs in the centre.

Supplies at the centre have almost completely dried up and staff are concerned that if they don't replenish their stocks soon they could be in trouble.

Sue Levings who works at the centre said: "On the last count we had 37 seal pups and over 70 hedgehogs that all need a clean towel or flannel on a daily basis so you can see how quickly we are running out!



"The people of Norfolk have always been really generous when we make our appeals, and we hope they will help us again.

"Any kind of small towel can be used to give the sick animals warmth and comfort, and they are really important for our daily work at the centre".

Towels and flannels can be dropped off in the yellow bins at the centre which is at Gayton Road, East Winch, King's Lynn, Norfolk PE32 1LG

Unfortunately staff at the centre are extremely busy and unable to collect towels. Towel collection points have been set up at Tesco - Hardwick and Downham Market.
