

The RSPCA East Winch Wildlife Centre has now been caring for seals and other British wildlife for over 21 years, and during that time has become a Centre of Excellence with trained and dedicated personnel caring for the patients.

The Centre's facilities include:

- A specially designed intensive care unit with adaptable cubicles
- A fully equipped operating theatre and x ray unit, providing the best in diagnostic and emergency treatment
- An extensive range of large pools, pens, waterfowl paddocks and aviaries, providing the right conditions and space so casualties can recover fully before being released
- A Bryce Baker tank to assess diving ability of cleaned oiled birds
- An orphans ward where young birds and animals can be hand reared ready for rehabilitation and release back to the wild
- A number of small loose boxes where recovering hedgehogs can be rehabilitated ready for release

We are also committed to finding out how our patients survive once they have been released and have successfully radio tracked tawny owls, common seals, collared doves and roe deer. We also fit BTO rings to our birds and tag our hedgehogs prior to release.

All of this, of course, costs money and the RSPCA only exists because of public donations. If you would like to send a donation, however small, together with this form, it will enable us to continue with our work.
